110th Anniversary Celebration of the Terryville Parish

On Sunday, September 11, 2022, we will celebrate the 110th anniversary of the Terryville Parish.

His Beatitude Metropolitan TIKHON, Archbishop of Washington, Metropolitan of All America and Canada, Primate (Presiding Archbishop) of the Orthodox Church in America, will be with us that morning to preside at the celebration of the Divine Liturgy that morning. The more ornate and complex hierarchical (bishop's) order of the Divine Liturgy will be used that morning.

Besides His Beatitude Metropolitan TIKHON and his aide or aides, our special guests for the occasion will be Archpriest Vladimir Aleandro and Matushka Suzanne Aleandro. Before Fr. Vladimir was ordained as a late vocations priest, after a previous career as a high school guidance counselor, he and his family were members here in our Terryville Parish. Fr. Vladimir retired few years ago, after a wonderful more than twenty years as Pastor of Christ the Savior Orthodox Church, Southbury, Connecticut—a parish that he and Matushka Suzanne founded. Fr. Vladimir will be offering us words of reflection and encouragement at our Anniversary Buffet Banquet in the afternoon on September 11.

Regarding that Banquet on September 11: In the early afternoon, after the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy, we will have an Anniversary Buffet Banquet at The Lyceum, 181 Main Street (Route 6), Terryville. The Lyceum is located across Main Street (Route 6) from Immaculate Conception Roman Catholic Church and Baldwin Park, just minutes away from our location at 34 Fairview Avenue. At The Lyceum there is ample parking and easy access. The commute between the two locations (our Church and The Lyceum) takes 5 minutes by car, and 15 minutes by foot.

For that Anniversary Buffet Banquet on September 11, tickets will be \$40.00 for adults, and \$20.00 for children. However, the Parish will provide tickets at a lesser cost, or, even, free of charge to any member of the Parish who wishes to attend the Anniversary Buffet Banquet, but who needs some help to do so. No one will be excluded because of need! If you need tickets at a reduced cost or no cost, please, contact Fr. John H., directly and privately. He will keep your need for such financial aid in confidence. (Also, please note: When we say member of the Parish," we mean BOTH people with roots in the Waterbury Parish and in the Terryville Parish. We are one!)
